I would like to announce that the first JN IOL Class will be on Thursday, May 29 starting at 7:00 PM.

Several SEOs previously reported that there are 7 interested students (JAX 1; CCBch 1; Harris 4; CF 1). Now is the time to finalize the registration and hopefully recruit additional students.

It will be up to the individual Squadrons to:

- Set their course fee, collect it and order the Student Kit – don't forget the Almanac, which is not included in the Student Kit
- Make arrangements to teach Chapter 2, Sextant.
- Make arrangements and provide help for taking the required sights.

### **Marine Safety Article: (P/C Alfred J. Fabbrini, SN)**

A draft interim rule for changing the placarding requirements for domestic vessels even down to the placard size specifications (increased from 36 square inches to 40 square inches as minimum size) has been underway for some time; however, until domestic rules are finalized and published by the USCG and new placards become available, it will not be possible for vessels 26 feet and over to comply with the MARPOL

Trash Placard requirement. For this reason vessel examiners are required to disregard this new rule until it becomes finalized. This should give time for domestic rules to be developed and published in the Federal Register and for new compliant placards to be developed, produced, and distributed throughout the Recreational Boating community.

As funding becomes available, the USCG may produce and distribute updated MARPOL decals for distribution. This interim guidance for the VE program will be amended or superseded as new placards become available through commercial sources of supply. Vessel examiners will have an excellent opportunity to carry on instructional conversations about the new MARPOL placard requirements that are being developed to heighten awareness of recreational boaters about the need to understand and comply with the MARPOL requirements and alert them to be aware that they need to procure and install new placards as soon as they become available.

In the long run such conversations may enhance the effectiveness of the teaching opportunities available during the conduct of Vessel Safety Checks.

### **The Refloating of the Largest Ship in Maritime History: (P/C Alfred J. Fabbrini SN)**

With the advances of technology we have gradually moved from the time when ships were made of wood and men were made of iron, to the “push button” seamanship of super modern luxury liners. The days of the romantic sailing ships whose dedicated captains had the high sense of honor to go down with their vessel are now only part of the past.

In January 2012, the 114,000 ton, 300 meter in length passenger ship “Costa Concordia” after hitting a reef ran aground and partially sank off the Island of Giglio in Italy because of the negligence of its Captain.

On September 16, 2013 the U.S. firm Titan with the Italian firm Misuperi developed the technology of refloating the ship – one of the most difficult maritime salvage operations undertaken in history. The Costa Concordia is now upright for the first time since January 2012, and ready to be towed away from Giglio for scrapping.
