

A TIP FROM THE D23 COOPERATIVE CHARTING DEPARTMENT Lt Robert Schaefer, P and D/Lt/C Ernst G Hofmann, JN NEW NOAA CHART FORMAT FOR SMALL CRAFTS

Just recently NOAA added another type of chart to their catalog, which is truly exciting for every small craft operator.

NOAA has come out with their super practical

Experimental BookletChart™

The size of charts has always been of questionable practicality on small and medium boats. The roll-up charts – some 42

inches by 66 inches are manageable only on large vessels. The next smaller size – the Small Craft accordion fold charts

selling for a little over \$20 – still measure 20 inches by 59 inches and are best viewed spread out on a double berth.

Electronic charts and plotters – ignoring their price tag – allow you to zoom-in and in the process you give up over view.

In an unfamiliar area you will probably have to zoom in and out several times just to keep track of where you are.

Now, at last, NOAA is making their marvels of information and detail available for you to print on an $8\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 sheet – on

both sides if you wish. Called Experimental BookletChart you can access them at http://www.nauticalcharts.noaa.gov/staff/BookletChart.html

SQUADRON EDUCATION OFFICER'S REPORT

The Power Squadron America's Boating Course - 3rd Edition is all new with a completely updated manual, outstanding graphics, and two bonus computer disks. The course manual is divided into five chapters.

The first four cover the required topics that all recreational boaters must know. In addition to the rules of the road, the four chapters cover the various types of boats, required safety equipment, navigation aids, lights and sounds, anchoring, communications afloat, adverse conditions, water sports safety, trailering, personal water craft safety, and knots and lines. The fifth chapter provides an introduction to digital charts and GPS waypoint navigation, a key skill for boating on larger lakes and rivers and coastal waters. This optional fifth chapter provides the background for more advanced piloting courses.

Squadrons have many functions which can help promote the ABC Course. Besides the obvious Webmaster, Social Media Manager and the Publications Editor, include:

Vessel Safety Check Committee

Liaison Officer makes contacts with allied organizations such as governmental agencies involving education and boater safety as well as boater advocacy groups, boat clubs, and yacht clubs.

Safety Officer often provides articles as well as forums in allied organizations or public gatherings. (The next edition will discuss model time lines, or look in PROLOG at www. USPS.org.)

THE EXCITING WORLD OF ON THE WATER TRAINING

With Advice from R/C Chris L. Windeler, SN, Chair BODCom "Let the word go forth!" Affordable on the water training is now a reality with the United States Power Squadrons®. Some of the Advanced Courses such as Seamanship and Advanced Pilot now have an optional on the water component for class members. These are conducted by squadron course instructors approved by the SEO. It is a valuable extension in which "book knowledge" can be practiced where it should be applied.

The basis for these programs comes from the USPS Boat Operator Certificate (BOC) initiative which is United States Coast Guard approved. BOC is recognized by organizations and agencies in the United States and worldwide. Four levels of certification will be offered. The first two are Inland Navigator and Coastal Navigator. The next two levels are Advanced Coastal and Offshore Navigator, and are under development. Each program includes all aspects of boating from leaving and returning to a dock or slip through offshore cruising.

The entry level certification, Inland Navigator, verifies an individual's basic boat handling skills for any single engine, wheel steered, vessels under 23 feet. Instruction begins in the classroom with courses and targeted seminars. The practical boating demonstration components include docking and undocking, low speed operation and highspeed maneuvers. For this, boats between 15 and 19 feet are considered ideal. The higher levels can be done with any vessel with appropriate communication capabilities for safety. Coastal Navigator teaches how to get from point A to point B and follows what was learned in Piloting. Level three, Advanced Coastal Navigation, provides certification for more difficult and challenging conditions. The final step, the Offshore Navigator Certificate, extends the cruising range to ocean crossings and includes courses in celestial navigation as well as cruise planning and offshore vessel management.

Contact your DEO or check out the BOC Webpage of the USPS Education Department for all the details. These programs are the cutting edge of a national awareness that boater skill development is

the key to greater boating enjoyment in a more secure marine environment. Watch for these developments. (ARTICLES FROM THE ENSIGN)






