## **Commander's Report – April 2014**

Continuing on from last month's report, we have had instructor re-certification and vessel examiner re-certification. Instructor certification and instructor re-certification is especially important since both must occur to keep the education program viable and functioning. Planning is continuing with the education schedule. When the Boat Operator Certification (BOC) has been completed and in action, we will be able to move some of our classes to the water, that will better educate the boaters through actual experience and that will make our education more appealing to the public.

National Safe Boating Week is coming up in May. Our activities will be different than last year and should be more attractive to the boating public. Help will be needed from a number of members to hand out safe boating literature and scheduled classes on the launching ramps, marinas and any other suitable place to meet with the boaters.

A significant part of education and other needs can be financed with grants from public and private organizations but someone is needed that is familiar with applying for a grant. Grants can cover many things but we must first plan and organize those needs in order to apply for a grant. There is the Co-op Charting program and Vessel Safety Check program. Signs, banners, printed materials or other forms of advertising may be needed to promote programs.

If anyone out there is familiar with seeking out grant money, please step forward and help find sources for grants to use for squadron related education or any other programs that may enhance safe boating.

## Secretary's Report – April 2014

Executive Committee Meeting, Thursday 13 March 2014

1906 - Meeting called to order with nine attendees; Cdr Bobby Bray, AP, P/C Will Benny, SN, P/C Jeff Wise, JN, Lt/C Don Roman, AP, Lt Beverly Davies, Lt/C Bob Spence, S, P/C Don Woods, AP, Lt/C Rita Wise, P, and P/C Ron Radford, AP.

Cdr Bray to ask if P/C William R. Myers, SN, will become the Squadron Chaplin.

**SEO Report - P/C Will Benny, SN** Piloting Course is on-going. Instructor recertification was completed for two with two more updated. Future plans are for an AP course following closely after the Piloting, JN is being offered by District on-line with “go-to-meeting” from mid-April to May, and Cruise Planning to be offered in the fall. We’ll have 3 instructors for AP which is a plus. We also want to hold an Instructor Development course, and after reviewing the instructor’s manual, the course has been extensively revised. Instructor’s manual has been ordered for AP, JN and Cruise, as well as three passports. Lastly, the ABC course will be held for the next two Saturdays, 15 & 22 March in the training classroom.

**Admin Report - P/C Don Roman, AP** There have been no new recommendations for the Squadron slogan, or name change. What we have so far will be presented at next week’s membership meeting. There was some discussion of summertime activities for Jun, Jul, and Aug. Activities will be selected from the recommendations submitted by the Squadron. This month, Mr. Joe Nolin, Volusia County’s Coastal Director, will speak at our meeting.

Cdr Bray wants to use Paypal, or some similar method to get potential students to prepay for ABC and other courses. **Action:** Robert Spence agreed to take this on and will report back.

**Auxiliary Report - Lt/C Rita Wise, P** Still selling the charity day tickets for \$5 and you can enjoy discounts of between 20 - 75% for purchases at Belk’s on Saturday 3 May from 0600 to 1000. The Lunch Bunch will meet at Dustin’s Buffet at the corner of Clyde Morris in Port Orange on 14 April at 1230. LB normally meets on the 2nd Monday of each month. They are still collecting aluminum cans and pop tops. Auxiliary dues are 25¢ per month , or \$3.00 per year.

**Treasurer’s Report - Lt./C Robert Spence, S** Motion was made and passed to keep Squadron dues the same as last year with no increase. Checkbook balance on Jan 31, 2014 was \$3,489.09 and on Feb 28, 2014 it was \$3,303.55.

Vessel Examiners are being required by the USCG to go through recertification training in order to retain their VE status. Training will be held at the USCG Auxiliary Building located at Halifax Harbor. Training will be held on Tues 18 Mar from 1800 to 2100 and again on Sat 22 Mar from 0900 to 1200.

Discussion of upcoming National Safe Boating Week, May 17 -22, included numerous comments. Last year, the successful elements included VSCs at area ramps, and public service announcements. Public outreach at Halifax Harbor was well organized, but did not successfully produce the public interest needed to justify the efforts. This year, it is suggested that we concentrate on PSAs and VSCs. A recommendation was made by Rita Wise to try and promote a Safe Boating Week Poster Contest in some local schools. A recommendation was also made to expand our efforts developing our relationships with our local boat dealers.

A recommendation was made by Jeff Wise that we develop liaison positions with various local organizations, such as, HCC, HRYC, Freedom boating, USCG Auxiliary, etc. This idea received wide support and Jeff has agreed to begin this program with visits to HCC and to Freedom Boat Club.

### **Marine Safety Article: (P/C Alfred J. Fabbrini, SN)**

The USCGAUX has taken the initiative to design an interactive online information repository for vessel examiners and program visitors.

The new online information center provides answers to any questions concerning recreational boating requirements 24 hours a day seven days a week. Any boater can contact the USCGAUX V-Directorate webpage to schedule a vessel safety check by clicking “I want a VSC” or to prepare for one by checking “Virtual Safety Check”. Once the boater properly completes the online form, the system automatically emails that request to five vessel examiners in or near the boater’s zip code. Any five can respond and schedule a vessel safety check with the owner, copying the other four who got the notice to avoid duplicate replies.

Since we have agreed to work together in this endeavor, I have reason to believe that USPS VEs should be included in the program and all we have to do is verify with the USCGAUX-V Directorate or start our own web.

### **The Tuna Boats at War: (P/C Alfred J. Fabbrini, SN)**

During World War II the prosperous San Diego tuna fishing industry was grounded – fishing in the Pacific was too dangerous.

The U.S. Navy informed the tuna fishermen that it needed their services; the fishermen - mostly Portuguese and Italians – were recruited by the Navy, their boats were painted battleship gray and given YP numbers, the naval designation for yard patrol craft. This small fleet was assigned to carry provisions and supplies of war instead of tuna.

The Diesel powered, wooden boats ranged in size from 100 to 150 ft. in length. Each boat had huge freezers designed to carry as much as 280 tons of fish and carried 17 crew members mostly fishermen with a handful of regular Navy sailors added. The boats were only lightly armed with just a couple of 50 caliber machine guns and depth charges, with a maximum speed of 10 knots and traveled thousands of miles delivering supplies to naval stations throughout the war zone - mostly meat and vegetables but occasionally even aviation fuel - and often helping Pilots locate and destroy Japanese ships.

Many of the fishing boats were sunk by enemy fire or wrecked by storm or accidents.
