ANCHORING

Anchor Rode

The anchor rode is the anchor line, thimble, shackles, and chain.

Select the correct type of line and size of chain.

Nylon line, either three - strand twisted or double braided is widely used for anchor rode, with the three strand twisted being the most common because it is modest in cost, easily cleaned and has high elasticity.

A twisted nylon line has a tendency to kink when used with mechanical winches sometimes making it difficult to store. Woven nylon line such as "Yale Braid" can overcome some of the short comings of three strand twisted nylon line.

How Much Chain / Line Length

A minimum of four to six feet of chain should be used between the anchor and the nylon rode. Storm anchors should have six to eight feet of chain. The weight of the chain enhances the holding power of the anchor by holding the shank horizontal. It prevents chafing and abrasion of the nylon line by rocks or shells. The size of the chain used should be matched to the strength of the anchor rode.

Scope

The ratio of the length of the rode to depth of the water is called the scope. The scope of an anchor rode is the ratio of its length to the vertical distance from the bow chock to the sea bed (i.e., the depth of the water plus the distance of the water to the bow chock).

Normally the scope of 7:1 is adequate for holding a boat. In conditions of high wind or strong current, additional scope should be paid out. Remember, too, to account for tidal variations when determining how much scope you will need.

The Art of Anchoring

When anchoring, be certain you have the bitter end of the anchor rode secured to the boat. Make sure your anchor rode will not cross the anchor rodes of other boats. After selecting your anchorage position head your boat into the wind or current, moving very slowly to your chosen site. Go far enough beyond the site to allow for the anchor rode length, then stop your forward movement and have someone lower the anchor being careful not to get stand in the bight of line. In the event that your boat does not drift astern on its own, gently reverse the engine. After about half of the planned scope is paid out, temporarily secure it to see if it is holding. Then the remainder of the rode should be paid out and secured.

The Art of Weighing Anchor

When ready to depart, start your engine and make sure it is operating properly. Power ahead slowly to a position directly above the anchor, taking in the rode as you proceed. Again, be careful not to stand in the bight of line. Usually, the anchor will break free of the bottom when you are over it. It can then be raised and secured.

If the anchor does not break free, it is probably fouled. Take in as much line as possible, then make fast the rode to a bow cleat and run your boat slowly in circles with the line taut, which should then free your anchor.

Bahamian Moor

One way to limit the amount of swinging a boat does when at anchor is to use the Bahamian moor, which basically consists of two widely spaced anchors off the bow.

Start by anchoring into the current, and then backing down to set the first hook.

Continue reversing to twice the distance you ultimately plan to use for your rode.

Drop the second anchor directly down-current from the first; make sure it's set, and then position yourself halfway between the two.

On some boats, it might be easier to use a stern cleat to set the second anchor because it keeps the rode away from the propellers.

Once the second anchor is set, you can then transfer the line to the bow. The biggest concern with establishing a Bahamian moor is slack on the lines because that can lead to fouling one of the rodes in the boat's running gear.
